Dear Chair Wyden, Ranking Member Crapo, Chair Smith, Ranking Member Neal, Chair McMorris Rodgers, and Ranking Member Pallone,

On behalf of the undersigned organizations, we write to express our strong support for the Connecting Our Medical Providers with Links to Expand Tailored and Effective (COMPLETE) Care Act (H.R. 5819/S. 1378).

As you well know, ongoing workforce shortages and a lack of care coordination continue to impede patient access to much needed behavioral health services. The COMPLETE Care Act would address these issues by helping clinicians and practices adopt innovative integrated delivery models such as the Primary Care Behavioral Health Model and Collaborative Care Model. By facilitating coordinated care between health professionals in the primary care setting, these team-based models have the capacity to increase access, reduce wait times for treatments, improve patient outcomes, and reduce overall treatment costs.

Unfortunately, despite robust evidence demonstrating improved patient outcomes, and availability for reimbursement, uptake of integrated care models remains low due to the up-front costs associated with implementation. To help support and encourage adoption of behavioral health integration in the primary care setting, the COMPLETE Care Act would temporarily increase the Medicare payment for existing integrated care codes and provide technical assistance to practices. It is a logical and much needed step toward ensuring integrated behavioral health care is more widely implemented, so that patients can get the care they require to lead healthy, fulfilling lives.

As you continue your important work to help support those struggling to access needed mental health and substance use disorder services, we urge your support of this important legislation in any year end package.
